Many of you know Jim Wangers or have heard about him from the early days of the Pontiac GTO. Jim was the advertising executive that marketed Pontiac during those "Glory Days." By the way, that was the name of the book he wrote about his days working with John DeLorean and many others at Pontiac. Jim is also known as the "Godfather of the GTO."

As I'm sure many of you know, Jim for over 30 years was a guaranteed speaker at just about every Pontiac major convention and car show. He was always good for a great story about the good old days. Many of his stories were told over and over but Jim always told them as if it was the first time he had told them. His style was so friendly and interesting that it never got tiresome. I must have heard his talks at least 25 times over the years.

Throughout the 1990s, the Southern California GTO club would have a western regional show over Labor Day weekend. Often times members of the Cactus GTO club would caravan over to the car show to hear Jim speak. We became good friends. He was always glad to see everyone he saw or met. He should have been a politician. In many ways he was for the GTO.


About 10 or 12 years ago, our club flew him to Phoenix and rented a room at the Doubletree hotel near Sky Harbor so he could give his presentation about the

Steve Barcak had Jim over several times to speak and set up a table at his Pontiac Heaven events. Jim loves people and Pontiac people even more. He always enjoyed his visits to Arizona, especially to drag race his GEETO Tiger or his Ponte Carlo when he could.

Wanger's Muffins

I was in LA about a week ago and decided to drive down to visit Jim at the Silverado Memory Care facility in Escondido. Jim is 93 now. Thanks to Thom Sherwood from the Southern Arizona chapter of POCI, who visited Jim on his birthday, I was able to connect with the lady that coordinates Jim's care. I drove the two hours down from LA in the morning, arriving at 11:00 am at the appointed time. I signed in at the front desk and was told which room to find Jim. I found Jim's room, but it was empty. I asked the staff where he was. We found him - sitting at a table with about 15 other senior men and women. They



were being shown by one of the staff how to make corn muffins! Jim was at the other end of the table from the demonstration with his head down asleep!
I couldn't help thinking, "Jim I don't blame you"... after all what's one of the most brilliant auto promoters of all time

But then things started to look up in a big way as Jim was woken up by the staff. He raised his head and gave me the biggest smile as I told him I am Bill McCoy from the Cactus GTO Club in Phoenix. They took us to the dining room, and we had the room to ourselves for half an hour until lunch was served. The last time I had spent time with Jim was 3 years ago at the GTOAA Nationals in Bellevue, Wash. He was signing his books and talking to people but at that time did not feel he was sharp enough to give his normal presentation, so we just talked for a while there.

This time, I had to keep bringing up topics from his past. He seemed to remember the things I brought up, but his comments were much shorter than in the past. I asked him about John DeLorean. He kind of took a deep breath and said, "He was really something."

I had to keep asking Jim questions. I asked if he had ever been invited to John's home for dinner. He said, "Oh sure, a few times." He said "John's first wife was a really sweet lady. She was really a nice person." I said I wish we could have found out what GM would have been like if John DeLorean could have made it to President of GM. Jim felt that John was a little too full of himself to be able to stay at GM. Jim said John was the most brilliant engineer there ever was, but he was also a real risk taker.

Birthday celebration in June


I asked Jim if he had seen many other Pontiac friends recently for his 93rd birthday. He said not too many. I found out later from Barbara, his care coordinator, that about 40 had been there to celebrate his birthday at the end of June. I guess he kind of forgot about that one. At 1:30 pm I told Jim I needed to drive back to Phoenix that afternoon. I could tell he was sad to see me go. But it was great to see him. I told him my father had passed away nine years ago, and that I kind of thought of him as my adopted father. After all, he is known as the "Godfather of the GTO"!

By the way for those that never liked his toupee...it's gone. But he's still the good old car guy we all managed to adopt as one of our best friends.
