I left our summer home in Fond Du Lac, Wisc. On Friday, Sept. 18 for the 4-hour drive to Pontiac, thinking I'd be early to clean up the car and get settled before the start of the show the next day. I arrived around 2:45 and between 4 hotels there were 50-60 "Pontiackers" and their cars already there with cocktail hour in progress. It was a nice social night meeting new friends.



Due to COVID 19, the normal Saturday driving tours to visit personal collections (about 85 miles and 3 collections) was cancelled. Instead, an impromptu Cruise In was held downtown around the court house square with mid 70s temps and bright sunshine.

I got there about 9:30 am and about 75 cars were there. The count grew throughout the day. I

registered and then toured the Pontiac museum, which is a must see for everyone. The library and research center are amazing, as well as the cars and a lot of memorabilia. A large Route 66 museum and other museums are also in Pontiac, however they were closed due to Covid 19 precautions.

A free trolley tour highlighting the places of interests and the painted



murals were really interesting and nice. Then I went on to meet new friends and talk "Pontiac." The day was topped off with dinner with everyone.



The Square in downtown Pontiac also has stores, shops, bars, and restaurants, and an awesome bakery, so there is plenty to do.

Sunday was the car show. I got one of the few parking spots around the square that were left and there is room for at least 100 cars. Adjacent streets and a municipal parking lot were used as well. All told, 211 Pontiacs registered for the show, which lasted all day with a high temperature of 74 degrees.

Judges reviewed cars in 23 classes of Pontiacs and awards covered 1st through 3rd place. The competition was stiff. About 25% of the cars were trailered in so some very

awesome vehicles. I was honored to take a 3rd place in the First-Generation Firebird Class with my '69 Firebird Convertible.

I did meet with Tim Dye, owner/curator of the Pontiac museum and editor of POCI's *Smoke Signals* magazine. He expressed his thanks for the monetary donation made to the Pontiac / Oakland Museum from the Desert Renegades and Cactus GTOs and said he would "love to have a group of Ponchos from AZ show up in the future."
