Pontiacs did well at Kissimmee auction

The first Mecum auction of the year was held in Kissimmee, Florida Jan. 7-16. The auction company sold a number of Pontiacs during the week, including 1967 Pontiac Firebird #001 and #002, both restored and owned by Richard Rawlings, host of the Fast n' Loud show on Discovery channel. Firebird #001 is a red/red convertible with a column shift and 326 CI motor, and the auction company expected a buy between \$175,000-\$225,000. Firebird #002 is a silver/black hardtop with a 4 speed and L76 HO 326 CI motor and Mecum expected that car would bring \$115,000-\$135,000. What did they get? State Legislative Report

Here is a sampling of the 588 Senate bills and 763 House bills that have been introduced so far this year that may be of interest to auto and truck hobbyists.

HB 2262: Legacy plates; plate issuance; reflectivity reissue without charge if within the 3 years of issue.

HB 2365: minimum vehicle speed; left lane. You cannot drive at a lower speed that the posted speed limit.

HB 2366: Criminal speeding driving @ 90 mph.

HB 2436: Motor fuel taxes; inflation adjustment. Beginning July 1, 2022, the fuel tax shall be adjusted to reflect the annual change in the Consumer Price Index published by the US Department of Labor.

HB 2437: Fuel: electric cars; hybrids; taxes. In fiscal year 2021-2022 all electric cars would be taxed at \$111 per year, FY 2022-2023 would bring the tax up to \$139 per year, and FY 2023-2024 would bring up the tax to \$166 per year. Hybrids would start the FY 2021-2022 with a tax of \$45 per year. FY 2022-2023 brings the tax up to \$56 per year and FY 2023-2024 would bring the tax up to \$67 per year.

For all electric cars and hybrids, fiscal year 2024-2025, the tax will go up according to the Gross Domestic Product Implicit Price Deflator reported by the US Dept of Commerce from 1/1/2021 to 12/31 of the prior year.

HB 2758: Emissions inspection; collectible vehicles; exempt if the vehicle is at least 15 years old and used in car club activities and you have collectable car insurance.

SB 1324: HOV lane; degradation; technical correction two or more occupants, M/C, public transport buses, alternative fuel vehicles or low emission and energy efficient vehicles.

SB 1384: State Parks; lottery; heritage fund. At the end of every fiscal year, funds left in the lottery fund would be deposited into the Arizona Fish and Game Fund (\$10 million), the Arizona State Parks (\$5 million), the Department of Child Safety (\$4 million) and other state departments.

SB 1460: ADOT; state motor vehicle fleet consider the viability of the state purchasing an electric vehicle.

We are up to the normal number of bills that are brought up each year for discussion. I do not know if there will be more of them. I think of these bills as a wish list in the feeble minds of our Senators and Representatives, but you never know what can happen next. Days have passed without the various Committees scheduling meetings, and there have been no votes on any bills. If the Legislature gets down to doing the state's business, I will keep you all informed about what is happening.
