25 club members attend the All Pontiac/GMC Truck Day organized by the POCI AZ chapter



Club Member Profiles

Michelle McAdams: 1968 Pontiac GTO

I was 20 years old and halfway through attending Rutgers College in New Jersey when I caught the fever.

"Dad, what is that?" as I stood in awe in front of a '65 Ford Galaxie parked on the campus. I'm not sure why it took me so long, considering we had a '69 Chevelle as our "family car" until 1983. But I knew once I graduated college the search would begin for my own classic car!

I started going to car shows and got a taste of what was really out there. I loved them all, except Mopars and Mustangs. When it came time to purchase a vehicle, my Dad convinced me that an old muscle car would not be practical for everyday use. So I bought a 1992 Chevy pickup that I ended up hating, and my quest to own a real car continued.



I found it difficult to decide what I wanted. First I wanted a '65 Galaxie, then a '66 Galaxie 500/XL, a '70 Chevelle, a '66 Nova, and believe it or not, a '66 GTO. However, I realized that if I was going to know everything about any car, I was going to have to choose one type and stick with it.

The more car shows I attended, the more upset I became, and the harder it was to keep coming home to that Chevy pickup. Finally, after attending the Fall Hershey (PA) show in 1993, I knew that I wanted a '68 or '69 GTO.

I started doing research and reading books and manuals so I wouldn't get swindled when it came time to buy my



car. Then one day in late November 1993, I got a big break when my search for a "real job" ended. The day I was hired I went out and bought all the *Auto Trader* magazines around. My search for the right GTO was officially under way. I began hoarding my money for fear that the right car would come along too soon and I wouldn't have the necessary cash.

By March 1994 I was ready to look at the first possible buy. I had never driven a GTO before and I was very excited. I remember being amazed at how much power a GTO really had. My search continued for months. I bragged such a good story about the

"perfect car" that I would someday own that I knew I had to bring home something really sweet. I looked at a lot of nice cars, but none seemed to be the right one for me. Some needed more work than I was willing to deal with, and others just did not fit the image of the perfect car that I had everyone expecting.

By June I was getting discouraged. Summertime was well on its way and I was feeling left out. I began to think that maybe my standards were too high, but my Dad advised me not to lower them and to keep on searching.



A few weeks later, fellow car enthusiasts found a '68 GTO from North Jersey in an *Auto Trader* publication they picked up at the GTOAA Nationals. The description of the car sounded nice, but they always did in the ads.

I took the information but really didn't believe this car would be any better than the others. Nevertheless, I went to see it. The GTO was really pretty nice. It drove like a monster

and I could have gone on for miles. The owner talked a good restoration story, but had not one single piece of paperwork to back it up.

I told him I could not pay his asking price without proof that all the work had been done as he claimed, so I went home. After 3 weeks and some nagging from my Pontiac friends, I took my Dad up for an overall inspection. He gave me two thumbs up. My decision was made; I emptied my bank account!


Unfortunately, it rained for the first half of my two-hour trip home. Early on, I got a taste of what it was like to own a Pontiac muscle car. Only ten minutes into my trip I pulled out of a Garden State Parkway toll booth beside a '70 Monte Carlo. I looked over and he gave me the sign, but because it was raining and I was very new to the car, I did something I never did again...I declined a race.

I can only say that it has been bliss ever since. I get a rush every time I start the engine, all these years later.

Pontiac Stats:

- 87, 684 GTOs were built in 1968; 9,980 were convertibles. The car was named Car of the Year by *Motor Trend* magazine.
- The rarest GTO built in '68 was the Ram Air II convertible model with an automatic transmission. Pontiac built only 22 with that combination. All told, only 47 RAII 400 ci. GTOs with an automatic were built in 1968.
